GENERAL NOTES.

A copy of every new issue of the Working Time Table Book, or section of the Book, is to be supplied to all concerned in accordance with Regulation 8.

It is imperative that each Stationmaster carefully check this Time Table, regarding the timing of trains, crossing arrangements, &c., so far as his own station or the stations he supervises are concerned. He will be held responsible for promptly bringing under the notice of the Chief Time Tables Officer (Room 2) and District Superintendent any inaccuracies that may appear therein.

Each Stationmaster must also compare the local times shown in this Time Table with the Sheet Time Tables posted for the information of the public at his own station or at the stations supervised by him, and he will be held responsible for the accuracy of the local timing of all Sheet Time Tables posted at stations under his supervision.

SPEED OF TRAINS.—It must be clearly understood by Enginemen, Motormen, and Guards, that the maximum permissible rate of speed authorized for the line and for the type of train, must not, under any circumstances, be exceeded over any mile or portion of a mile of the journey. In any instance where the times shown in the Working Time Table to run any section, conflict with the maximum permissible rate of speed authorized for that particular section, or with any safe working or other instruction, the Time Table times are not to be adhered to, and the matter is to be promptly reported to the Chief Time Tables Officer and District Superintendent by Stationmasters and others engaged in Train Running. Drivers or Motormen to bring the matter under the notice of any Superior Officer, who must report the matter to his Superintendent, and in addition forward copy of his report direct to the Chief Time Tables Officer.

ASSISTING ENGINES ON PASSENGER TRAINS.—Horse boxes must not be accepted for conveyance by any particular train if assisting engine mileage would result. Stations at which assisting engines are attached to Passenger trains must wire particulars to "Cars" and District Superintendent on each occasion. This, however, does not refer to the banking engines used on the Ingliston, Warrenheip, and Stawell banks.

OVERLOADING OF PASSENGER AND MIXED TRAINS.—Except in respect of the Down and Up Adelaide, Sydney, and Albury Expresses, Passenger trains on the Healesville, Lilydale, Fern-tree Gully, and Warburton Lines, also Passenger trains through the Geelong tunnel on the Down journey, authority is hereby given for one engine on Passenger trains to haul equal to one vehicle over the schedule load without assistance.

This extension of the scheduled load is intended to apply only in cases where double heading would otherwise be imperative on account of Passenger traffic or the conveyance of corpses. It is not to be availed of to enable horse boxes, &c., to be accepted by Passenger trains.

In all cases other than mentioned above, where it is desired to increase the authorized load of a Passenger (or Mixed) train, the Depot station concerned must wire particulars of the nature and urgency of the excess leading to the District Superintendent (Control) who, after consultation with the District Rolling Stock Superintendent, will grant permission when considered absolutely necessary.

PASSENGER AND MIXED TRAIN RUNNING.—Depot stations must obtain full particulars from Guards of the late running of Passenger and Mixed trains. In the event of any time being lost by the engine, the cause, also engine number and class, must be ascertained from the Driver, and included in the T.R.N. Report. Drivers will require to explain the cause of any time lost that in the aggregate exceeds the time gained on the journey.

When a Passenger or Mixed train is blocked at a roadside station a T.R.N. Report must be sent by the Stationmaster at the station at which the block occurred, and if the train that caused the block was running late the cause of such late running (whether overtime on section or other cause) must be given if ascertainable.

GENERAL NOTES—continued.

ENGINE RUNNING SCHEDULES.

The Engine Running Schedules shown in this Time Table for Passenger trains are based on the authorized number of vehicles that can be hauled over the various sections, and in the case of Mixed and Goods trains, on certain specified loads.

Subject to the special rates of speed shown on pages 210 to 230 of General Appendix, or to any speed restrictions published from time to time, it will be the duty of the Driver to increase the speed of his train in proportion to the reduction of the load of train. That is to say, a train with one-tenth less than the published Vehicle, Ruling Grade, or Sectional load over a section, should occupy that section for less time than that allowed for the published load of that particular train.

In the case of a Passenger or Mixed train, however, this will only apply when such train is running late; or when special circumstances render it necessary that train should arrive at the next station earlier than usual.

The above is a summary of the full instruction shown on pages 236 and 237 of General Appendix, and is given for the purpose of ready reference only.

The Running Schedule for a "Light" Engine ("V" Class excepted), or two "Light" Engines attached, or in either case with Van only attached, shall be the fastest stopping Passenger or Mixed Schedule, as the case may be, for the section over which the Engine runs, subject to the special rates of speed shown on pages 210 to 230 of General Appendix. "V" Class Engines "Light," or with van only attached, will observe the Engine Schedule for a Through Goods train subject to a maximum speed of 35 miles per hour.

TIME TABLE REFERENCES.

- * Trains will not stop to pick up or set down Passengers at stations marked thus.*
 - § Train will stop when required to pick up or set down Passengers at stations marked thus§, excepting for Inter-Suburban Station travelling. Passengers desiring to alight must give notice to the Guard at the previous stopping station, where Guards must also inquire. This will not apply, however, where mails are concerned, and in all such cases trains must stop for the delivery or receipt of mails, even when not required to do so for Passengers.
 - ¶ Trains to stop to pick up Passengers at Stations marked thus¶. Necessary signal to be exhibited when trains are required to stop.
 - †† Trains to stop to set down, but not to pick up Passengers at Stations marked thus††. Passengers desiring to alight must give notice to the Guard at the previous stopping station, where Guards must also inquire.
 - T. These are Tablet Stations, at which a Tablet must be obtained before starting, and delivered up on arrival.
 - E.S. These are Electric Staff Stations, at which an Electric Staff must be obtained before starting, and delivered up on arrival.
 - W. These are Watering Stations.
 - ‡ Trains marked ‡ run only if required. Special advice will be issued by the General Superintendent of Transportation, District Superintendent, or Depot stations when the running of such trains is necessary.
 - † These are Staff Stations, at which the Staff, a Staff Ticket, or a Line Clear Report must be received before starting, and delivered up on arrival.
- The switching in and out of Block Posts must be done strictly subject to Block Rule 23.
The switching in and out of Electric Staff Posts must be done strictly in accordance with the instructions shown on pages 441 to 449 of General Appendix.

N.C. There is no one in charge at these stations.

The names of stations on the various lines where there is a "Caretaker" are printed in italics. Express, Passenger, Rail Motor, Mixed, and Car Goods trains must stop at stations where so scheduled in the Time Tables. Where the times of arrival and departure of trains are not expressly stated, the times shown are those of departure from stations.

Down trains are given odd and Up trains even numbers. (Suburban Lines excepted.)

The lines above the departure time and figures at side indicate the station appointed for trains to meet or pass each other, also the numbers of the trains to be so met or passed.

For example, on page 136 of South-Western Line Time Table appears the following:—

The above example indicates—

- (1) That number 8 (Up) meets number 5 (Down) and waits and follows No. 12 (Up).
- (2) That number 10 (Up) meets number 5 (Down).
- (3) That number 12 (Up) meets number 5 (Down) and precedes number 8 (Up).

It will therefore not be necessary to use the terms "Down" and "Up" as the odd or even number will denote the direction in which trains are running.

Footnote references are indicated by Capital letters A, B, C, &c., shown after the figures in train schedules, such as 9,6A shown for number 10 (Up) train at Newport, on page 136 of South-Western Line Time Table.

PASSENGERS TRAVELLING IN VANS OF GOODS TRAINS.

The Goods Trains shown hereunder may be stopped (subject to grade limitations contained in the General Appendix, page 305) to pick up or set down passengers, provided the conditions set out in the instructions in the General Appendix (pages 304-306) be complied with. This privilege will not apply on days that powder is forwarded. In the event of any of the trains specified being altered, the foregoing instruction will apply to the altered train:—

No. 19.—The 8.40 a.m. (No. 19) Express from Melbourne Mondays, will only convey passengers for stations beyond Ballarat (excepting North Ballarat and Werribee), and is the through Serviceton train on that day. The stoppages at Bacchus Marsh, Ballan, and Bungaree are for Departmental purposes only. On Mondays, therefore, the 7.40 a.m. passenger terminates at Ballarat, and conveys all the roadside passengers and van goods for stations Deer Park to Ballarat inclusive, and for Branch Lines radiating from Ballarat.

Note.—Tail rope not to be used at Werribee.

Except as shown hereunder the Double Line Block Telegraph System is in force on the Up and Down journey on the following sections:—North Melbourne Junction and South Kensington Junction; South Kensington and Maribyrnong River Box; Maribyrnong River Box and Footscray Junction "A"; Footscray Junction "C"; Footscray "Q" and West Footscray and Totnessham; Totnessham and Sunshine; Sunshine and Warrenheip and Ballarat East Box; Lydiard-street Box "B"; Ballarat, and North Ballarat "C"; North Ballarat "C" and Linton Junction "D". Three-position signalling is in force on the Up journey between Franklin street Junction and No. 1 Box, Spencer-street, on the Up and Down journey between Franklin-street Junction and North Melbourne Junction.

Track Block System is in force on the Down Journey between No. 1 Signal Box, Spencer-street, and Franklin-street Junction.

The Permanent Block System is in force on the Up and Down journey between Dudley-street and North Melbourne Junction; Dudley-street and

Weighbridge Junction; Weighbridge Junction and South Kensington Junction (Goods lines only.)

South Kensington switches out after the last Up Goods clears early Sunday morning, until Midnight.

Maribyrnong River Box is switched in as a Block Post on week days and Saturdays from 5.45 a.m. until 10.45 p.m.

Tottenham is switched in as a Block post on week days (Saturdays excepted) from 6.35 a.m. to 10.35 p.m., and on Saturdays from 6.35 a.m. until the 3.10 p.m.

Up Bendigo passenger clears. (Not open Sundays)
Bank Box is open as Special Telegraph Block Post on Mondays, for the running of Nos. 17 and 19. See General Appendix, pages 150-154.

Note.—On Mondays, Thursdays, and Saturdays, and on other days when the 5.6 p.m. (No. 31) Express is extended to Adelaide, passengers for Victorian stations are not to be permitted to travel by the 4.30 p.m. (No. 30) Express. ASSISTING ENGINES ON PASSENGER TRAINS.

Depôt Stationmasters and others concerned are specially enjoined to keep a constant watch on this matter, and every effort is to be made to reduce the assisting engine mileage to the lowest practicable limit.

Horse boxes must not be accepted for conveyance by any particular train if assisting engine mileage would result.

Stations at which assisting engines are attached to Passenger Trains must wire "Cars" and District Superintendent on each occasion, stating reason. Stationmasters, Spencer-street and Flinders-street, to forward return daily. This paragraph does not, however, refer to banking engines on the Ingliston, Warrenheip, or Stawell banks.

PASSENGER AND MIXED TRAIN WORKING.

OVERLOADING.

In all instances where it is desired to increase the authorized load of a Passenger or Mixed Train, the Depôt or Sub-depôt Station concerned must send a wire giving full particulars concerning the nature and urgency of the excess loading to the District Superintendent, "Control," who will only grant permission when considered absolutely necessary, and after consultation with the District Rolling Stock Superintendent.

TRAINS WAITING TIME.

Whenever a Passenger or Mixed Train is standing at a station waiting its scheduled departure time, the guard must show such time in the Transportation "Other causes" column of his Statement of Running.

PASSENGER TRAINS.

T.R.N. Reports must be given prompt despatch, and Reporting Stations must be careful to obtain full particulars from Guard when trains are running late. In the event of any train being lost by engine the cause and engine number and class must be ascertained from the Driver and included in the report.

Guards must furnish Stationmasters with correct particulars as to cause of late running, any special occurrences on journey being detailed, and will require to show, in the right-hand margin of their running statements, particulars of any horse-boxes, carriage, hearse, or other trucks attached to or detached from their trains, the number and class of vehicle, and stations from and to, to be given.

When any of these trains are blocked at roadside stations, a T.R.N. Report must be sent by stations at which the blocks occurred, and if the train that caused block was running late, the cause of such late running must be shown if ascertainable. If blocked by Mixed or Goods trains, state whether over time or section or other cause.

PASSENGER-TRAIN LOADS.

Except in respect of the Down and Up Adelaide, Sydney and Albury Expresses, Passenger trains on the Healesville, Lilydale, Ferntree Gully and Warburton lines, also through the Geelong tunnel on the Down journey, authority is hereby given for one engine on Passenger trains to haul equal to one vehicle over the schedule load without assistance.

This extension of the schedule loads is only intended to apply in cases when double-heading would otherwise be imperative on account of passenger traffic or the conveyance of corpses. It is not to be availed of to enable horse-boxes, &c., to be accepted by passenger trains.

Depot stations must be careful to obtain full particulars from Guard when late, and in event of any time being lost by engine, the cause and engine number and class must be ascertained from the Driver and included in wire.

On lines that have Engine Running Schedules, this information can readily be compiled, for after allowing for the schedule running time between stations, the remainder of the time available before the train is due to depart from the Station as per Working Time Table is for transportation work.
